3-day long numismatic show kicks off at WTC

The three-day long numismatic show kicked off on Friday at World Trade Centre in Mumbai where over 100 stalls have exhibited rare collection of coins, demonetised currency, stamps and antique pieces.

During the three-day show, Mumbaikars can take their coins and notes to the show for a free appraisal at Todywalla Auctions counter.

"More than 1,600 different items will go under the hammer over the three-day auction, spanning from the beginnings of Indian coinage, a silver punched mark coin about 2400 years old from the Magadha Janapada period," numismatist Malcolm Todywalla said.
